# In All Honesty: A game preview

On paper, Nevada looks like they should be nearly unstoppable with three superstar caliber players in Luke Babbitt, Armon Johnson and Brandon Fields, as each of them average more than 15 points per game. Despite the star-power, the Wolf Pack haven't measured up to be what one would expect. Their past three games have included victories over Hawaii and Boise State by just six points, and a loss on the road to Fresno State. # Pau Gasol hoping Babbitt soon claims crown as NBA's ugliest person

University of Nevada forward Luke Babbitt continues to light up stat-sheets at the college level with his 21.4 points 9.9 rebounds per game this season.
